

ATG – Arrival Transfer Guide

1. Arrival Overview

Athens International Airport (ATH) "Eleftherios Venizelos" is the primary gateway to Greece. At 07:00 on a Saturday, the airport will be active with both European and international arrivals. You will arrive at the Main Terminal.

2. Airport Exit Estimate

* **Passport Control & Baggage:** 45–75 minutes. * **Estimated time ready to depart airport:** 07:45 – 08:15. * **Note:** Saturday mornings can be busy; allow extra time if you are arriving from a non-Schengen country.

3. Likely Onward Transport Options

* **Metro (Line 3 - Blue):** Direct service from the airport to Piraeus. * **Express Bus (X96):** A 24-hour dedicated bus line connecting the airport directly to Piraeus Port. * **Suburban Railway (Proastiakos):** Direct rail link to Piraeus. * **Taxi / Rideshare:** Available 24/7 at the designated ranks outside Arrivals.

4. Recommended Strategy for this Arrival Time

Since you are catching a ferry to Mykonos, the **Metro (Line 3)** or the **X96 Express Bus** are your most reliable options. * **The Metro** is generally faster and avoids morning road traffic. * **The X96 Bus** is the most cost-effective and drops you closest to the ferry quays. * **Check the live timetable** for the next departure upon arrival to decide between the two.

5. Route to Piraeus Port

* **By Metro:** Follow signs for "To Trains." Cross the pedestrian bridge to the station. Take **Line 3 (Blue)** towards "Piraeus." The journey takes approximately 55–60 minutes. * **By Express Bus:** Exit the Arrivals level (between Exits 4 and 5). Look for the ****X96**
